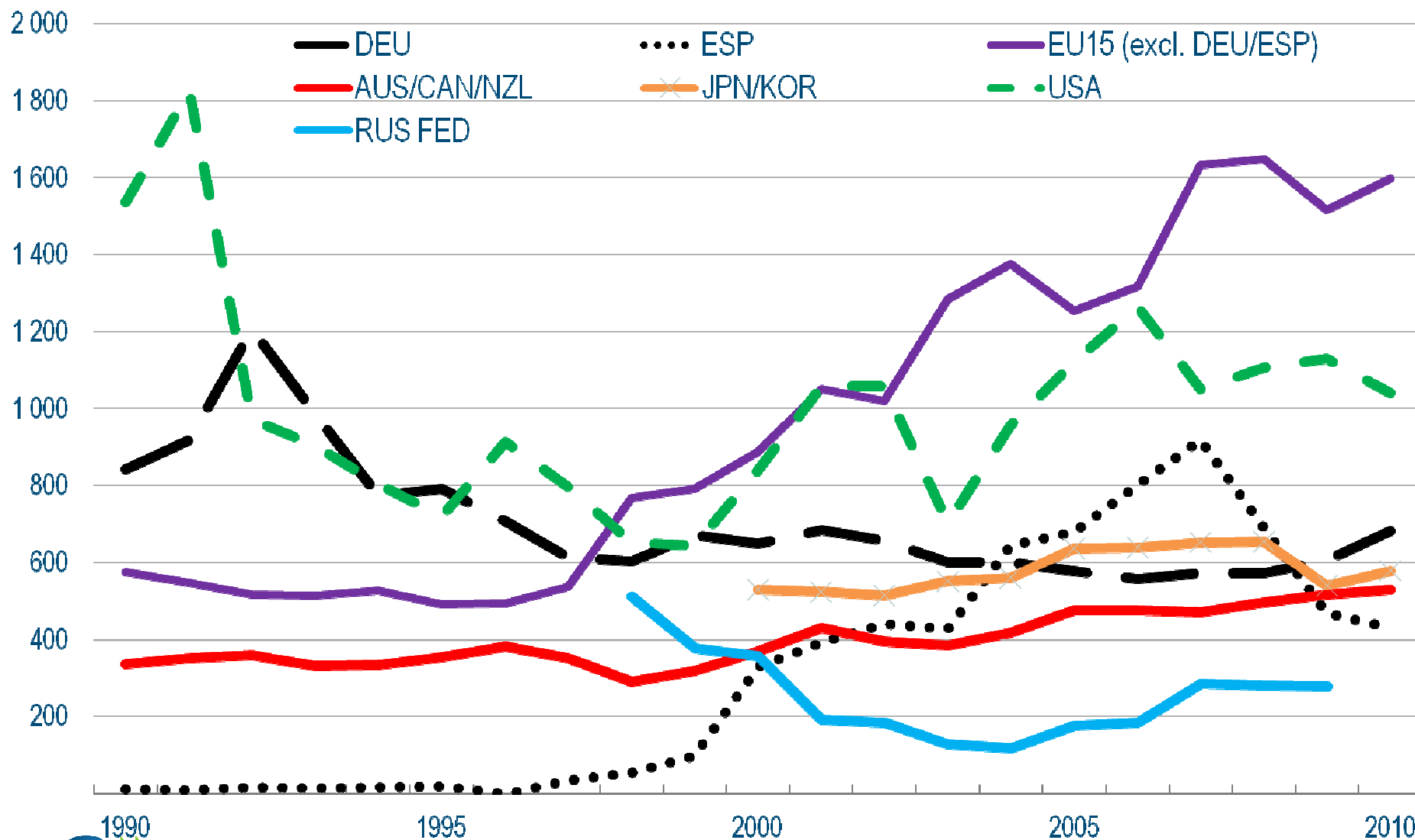

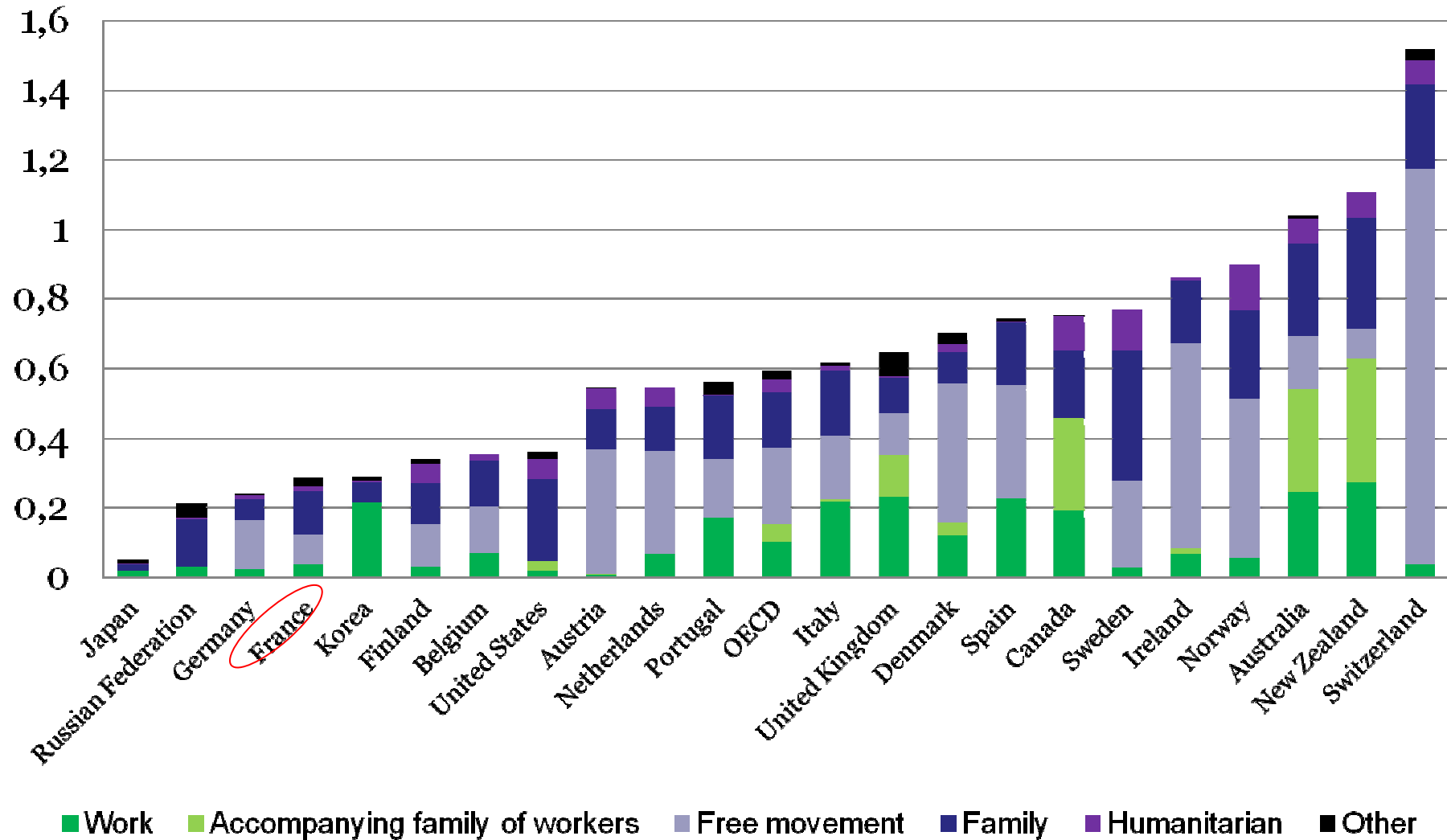

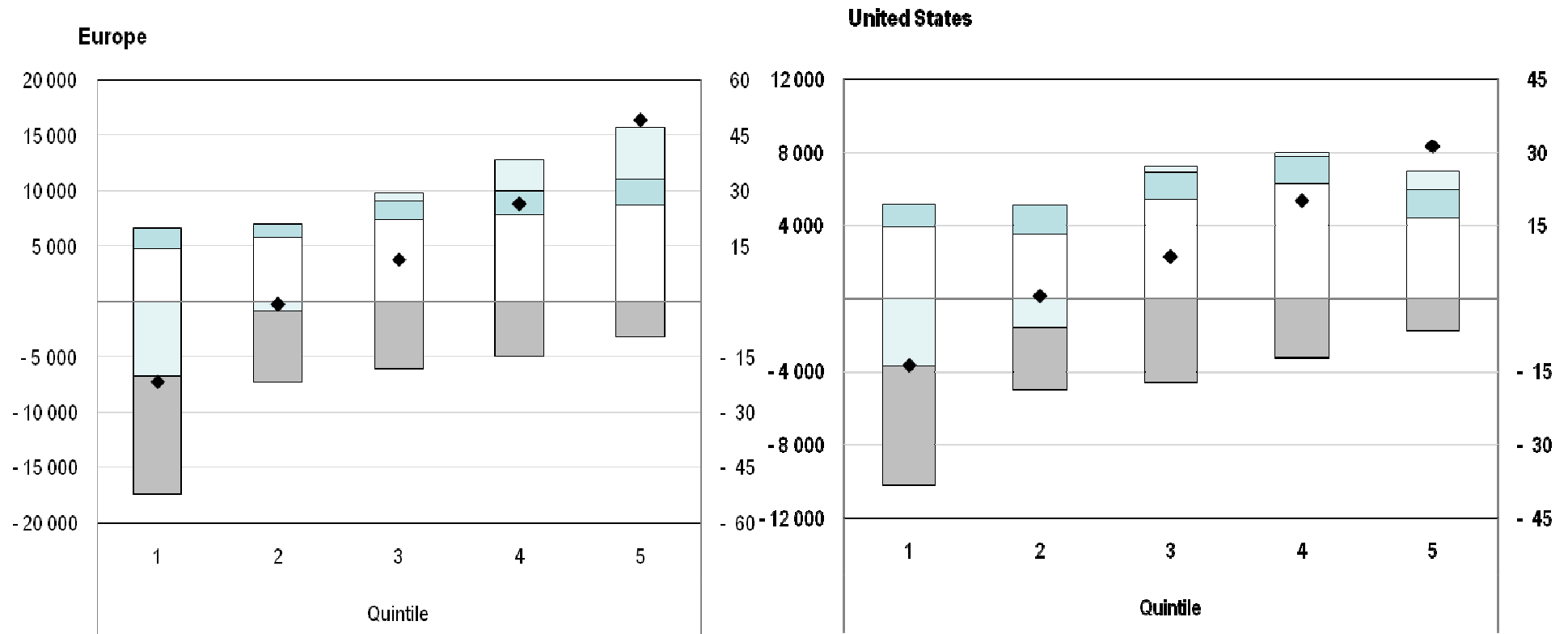
Permanent-type immigration by main category as a % of the total population, 2009

2000-10 occupational change, by growth quintile and demographic group

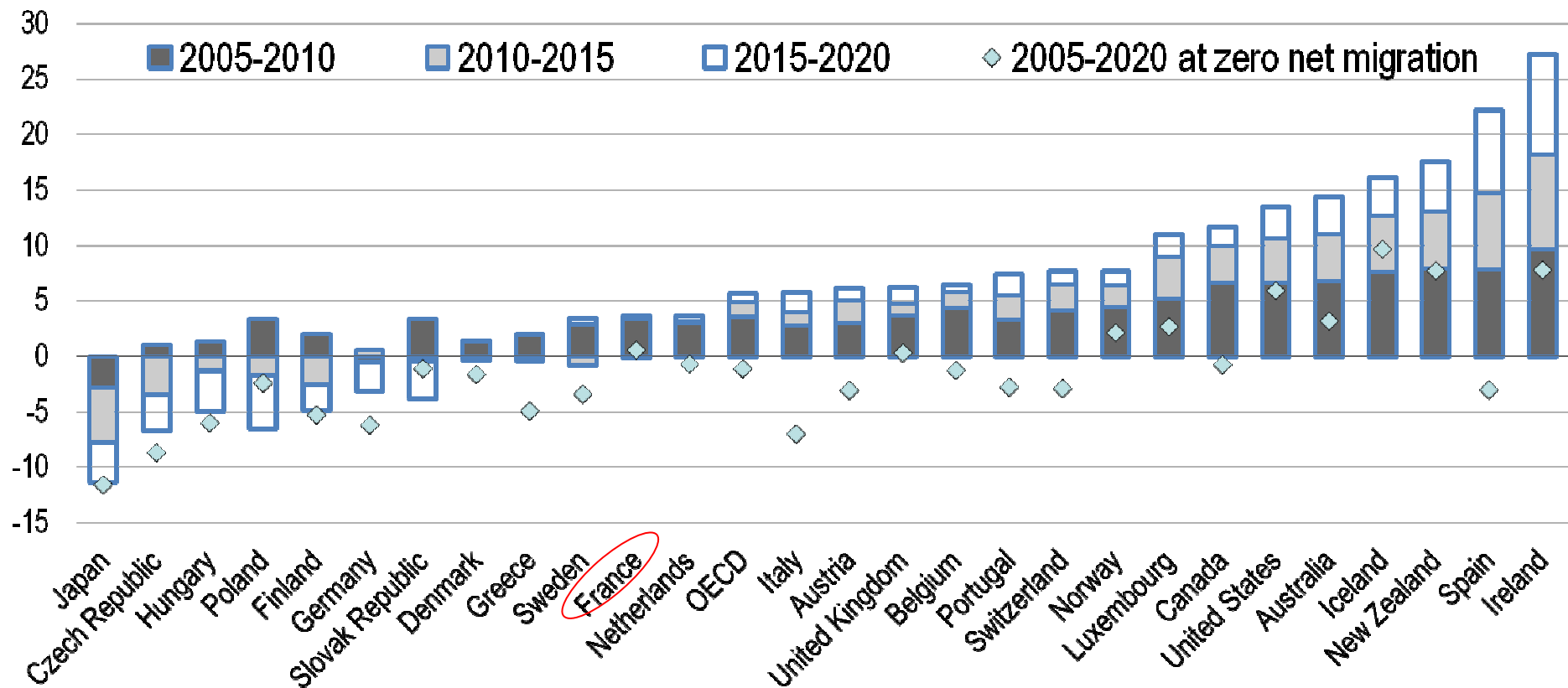
Older workers (retirees)

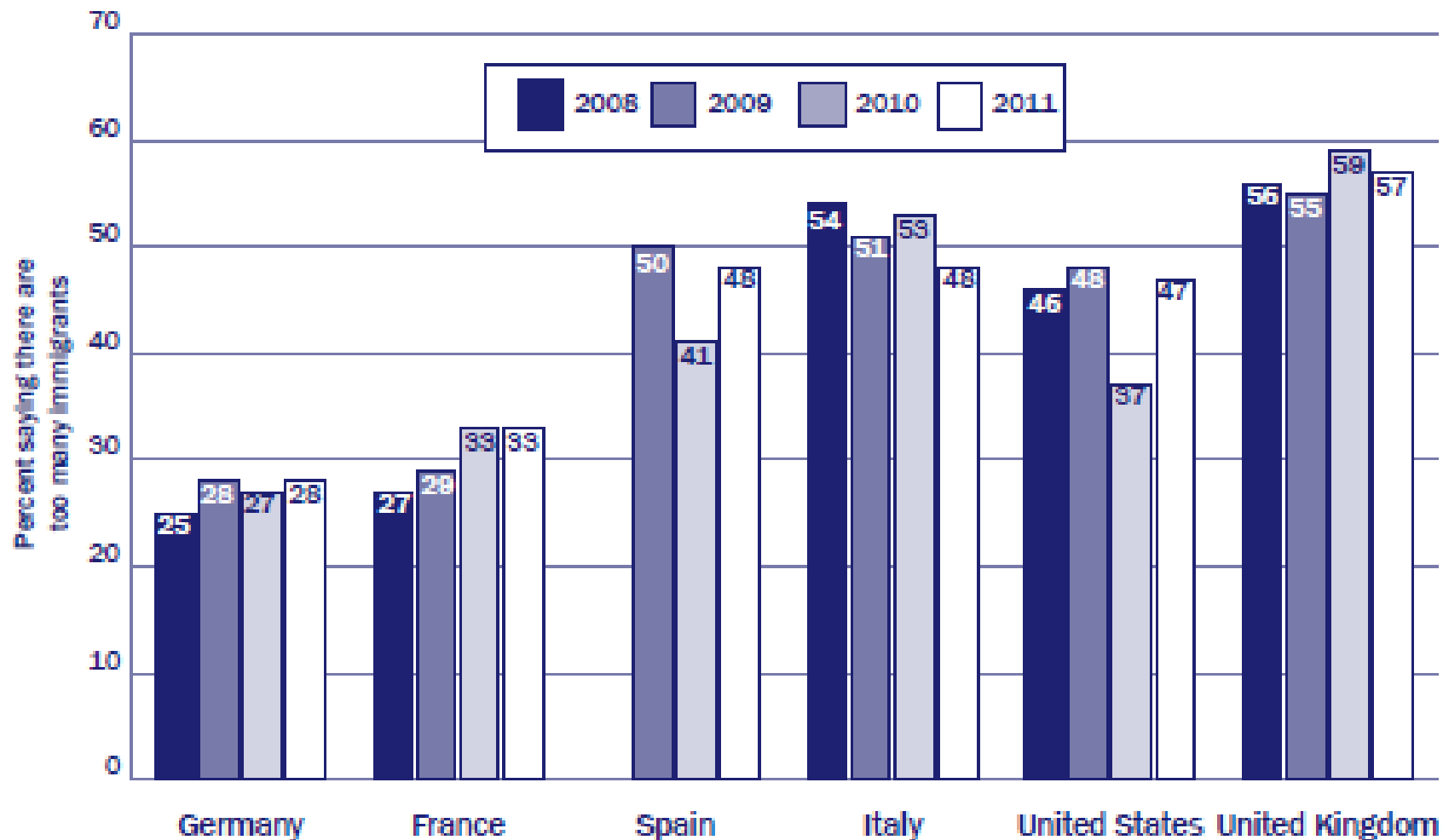
Population ageing and migration
